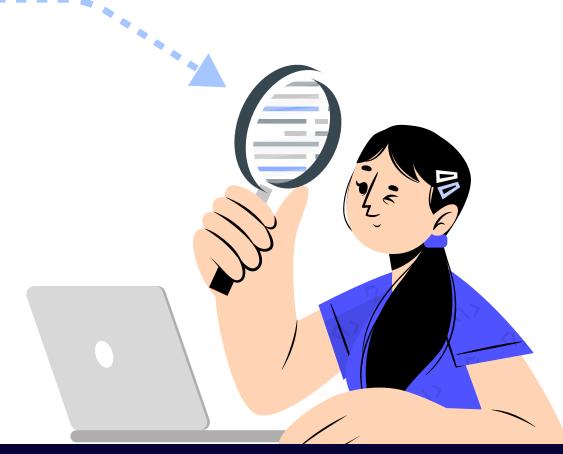

1) Get Power Apps Access

Explore Power Apps with a 30-day free trial. Once you've tried it out, request licenses for your team to dive in fully.

Log in with your Microsoft ID, select your role (Admin, Maker, or Contributor), and set up your work environment.

3) Explore the Interface

Explore Power Apps' main tools – from creating apps to finding resources, it's all accessible in the left navigation pane.
